Stopping the Spread of Invasive Species

A couple of weeks ago I attended the Professional Vegetation Management Society (PVMA) and Alberta Invasive Species Council (AISC) annual conferences. PVMA held very informative sessions on bee biology and behaviour as well as identifying disease and pests on trees. AISC focused on spreading awareness for the increasing pressure our province is facing from invasive species. Both terrestrial and aquatic species are threatening our ecosystems. We also heard how the threat of climate change is going to make it harder to combat these species. AISC along with the Alberta Government are running multiple campaigns to increase awareness amongst the public.




Play Clean Go is a campaign aimed at outdoor recreationists. Whether you are a trail user, camper or have an off-highway vehicle you can accidently move invasive species from place to place.

- Start Clean: Before leaving home take a second to inspect and remove dirt, plants, bugs from clothing, boots, gear, pets and vehicles.
- **2. Stay On Designated Trails:** Not only does this save the surrounding environment but it limits contact with potential harmful species.
- **3. Leave Clean:** Before leaving inspect your equipment and remove any dirt, plants or bugs. Plant seeds can be stuck on you, your pets and equipment.


When you are out boating this summer make sure to stop in at one of the boat inspection sites around the province. Zebra/Quagga mussels are becoming a huge threat to Alberta water ways so be vigilant and do your part to stop the spread across Canada. Inspectors are only searching for mussels and if they are found your watercraft will receive a high pressure wash to stop the spread of these mussels. They have even started to utilize dogs that have been trained solely to detect mussels.

- 1. **Clean:** Clean and inspect watercraft, trailer, and gear. Remove all plants, animals, mud at the access area of dock. Use a bleach solution to clean gear and pressure wash boat surface. Remember to clean away from storm drains and waterways.
- 2. **Drain:** Drain all water before leaving the water body.
- 3. **Dry:** Dry the watercraft and gear between trips and allow all wet areas on your boat to dry. Leave compartments open and sponge out standing water.



You may be surprised to know that one of the biggest threat to biodiversity in Alberta waterways is Prussian Carp which is a species of wild goldfish. This fish along with other aquatic invasive species can be bought at the local pet store. The Alberta Government recently launched a campaign called "Don't Let it Loose" to target the illegal release of aquatic species. Never release aquatic or domestic pond water, plants, dead or live animals into water bodies. They have already found large numbers of Prussian Carp in the Bow, Rosebud, Red Deer, and South Saskatchewan rivers. Please do your part and dispose of aquarium species properly.
